A. in Humanities from San Francisco State University. She is the author of four chapbooks and two full-length collections: *The Zen Piano-Mover* from NFSPS Press, 2004 winner of the Stevens Manuscript Award, and *In the Body of Our Lives*, Sixteen Rivers Press 2010. She is the recipient of a number of awards including the Inkwell Magazine award, the Saranac Review Prize, and Sow's Ear Awards. Her work has appeared in *Alaska Review*, *Cincinnati Review*, *Hayden's Ferry*, *Shenandoah*, *Verse Daily*, *Poetry Daily* and *American Life in Poetry*. Her latest book published by Grayson Books, *Everything Turns Into Something Else* is a collection of poems about borders, dualities, and ambivalence.



**Andy Fogle** was born in Norfolk, Virginia, grew up in Virginia Beach, and lived for a decade in Northern Virginia, teaching for the DC Creative Writing Workshop, DC WritersCorps, and George Mason University, where he earned a B.A. in English and an M.F.A. in Creative Writing. He has been an educator for over twenty years, and now lives in upstate New York with his wife and two children. He teaches English at Bethlehem Central High School and is a doctoral student in Curriculum & Instruction at SUNY Albany. His poetry, non-fiction, and co-translations with Walid Abdallah have appeared in *Anomaly*, *Gargoyle*, *Image*, *RHINO*, and elsewhere. He is the author of six chapbooks, and will be reading from his current book, *Across From Now*, which is grounded in his move from Virginia to New York,

as he fretted between times and places, between here-and-now and there-and-then, trying to make a little beauty out of impermanence.
