For the past decade Patrick Daly has been working for a software start-ups, writing poetry on his lunch hours. His poem *Words* was a 2015 poem of the year in the *New Statesman* (London). He has published poetry in many other magazines and e-zines, most recently in *Portside*, *Ekephrasis*, and *The Sand Hill Review*, and poems of his have appeared recently in anthologies including *Extreme Sonnets*, *A Bird Black as the Sun*, and *America, We Call Your Name*. His poem *Tiananmen Square* received honorable mention in the Pushcart Prizes, and his chapbook *Playing with Fire* won the Abby Niebauer Memorial Prize. His first full-length collection is *Grief and Horses*, just published by Broadstone Press. He likes walking in the woods, watching the Warriors, the works of William Shakespeare, and even a few things not beginning with “W”.



Charlotte Muse lives, teaches and writes in Menlo Park. She’s taught poetry at San Francisco State, U.C. Berkeley Extension, the Lifelines Project, and many other venues. Her awards include the Allen Ginsberg Award, the Elinor Benedict Poetry Prize, the Yeats Society of New York’s Poetry Prize, and two Atlanta Review International Publication Awards, among others. Her work has been published in journals, magazines, and anthologies. One of her chapbooks, *A Story Also Grows*, was made into a letterpress edition by The Chester Creek Press and bought by the Smithsonian, Library of Congress, Brown University, and UC Santa Cruz rare book collections. Her new book of selected poems, *In Which I Forgive the River* (Broadstone Books) is her first full-length collection. She’s married to the poet Patrick Daly, struggles to learn piano keyboard, and likes to be outside, walking or watching.
